

### Breakout Group Feedback: Healthy Eating, Active Living



- 32% of Anne Arundel adult residents report a BMI greater than or equal to 30 kg/m<sup>2</sup>
- From 2017-2019, the prevalence of diabetes in all age groups, except 45-54, increased.
- The prevalence of diabetes in the county is higher in males.
- Although the Black population is only 16.4% of Anne Arundel County residents, this community has a higher prevalence of diabetes than white residents.

### What's the story behind the data?

- The increase among the 65+ community could have to do with insurance/medicare access
- Obesity rates are increasing nationally
- Portion sizes are too large, as well as increased sugar and sodium rates in foods
- Poor childhood nutrition education + unhealthy eating habits
- Finances unhealthy food is less expensive
- Food deserts/swamps

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# Health Care Access


- 23,561 county residents are uninsured
  - The Hispanic population is the highest uninsured demographic in the county.
- Anne Arundel County's primary care physician, mental health provider and dentist ratio is worse than the Maryland average. There are less healthcare providers available to and serving residents.
- 77.2% of total county residents reported receiving a routine check-up in the past year.
  - 9% of residents were unable to see a doctor due to cost.


